

Environmental Policy

Policy statement

ETNA Community Centre is committed to the importance of respecting the environment and promoting sustainable development. We recognise that we have a duty to prepare our visitors, and staff with the knowledge and skills to look after our planet, manage the world's resources wisely and make a positive contribution by improving our local area. We therefore aim to develop good habits and behaviour patterns amongst our stakeholders.

Impacts

We recognise that the current main environmental impacts, in decreasing levels of impact, are:

- Energy consumption;
- Waste generation;
- Water consumption; and
- Sustainable procurement.

Objectives

- Enhance energy-efficient envelopes ensuring all light bulbs are LED and increase loft and flat roof insulation;
- Introduce renewable technologies (including solar panels and air sources heat pumps);
- Purchase an additional hot composter to decrease transport of food waste to be composted by a supplier;
- Start measuring waste going to composting;
- Purchase a water butt to collect rainwater for garden irrigation as opposed to mains water use; and
- Ensure ethical products and services are purchased by adopting a Sustainable Procurement Policy.
